A LETTER TO FRIENDSWOOD

Fellow Friendswoodians,

On January 22, 2018 I filed to have my name placed on the ballot as a candidate for Mayor of Friendswood in the 2018 General Election. My decision to take this action was not made in haste, but rather after careful deliberation and many discussions with family, friends, and many of those who graciously and cheerfully supported me in last year's election. I also turned to prayer, always seeking guidance and asking for wisdom, strength, and courage in making important decisions. 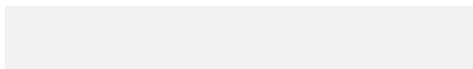
